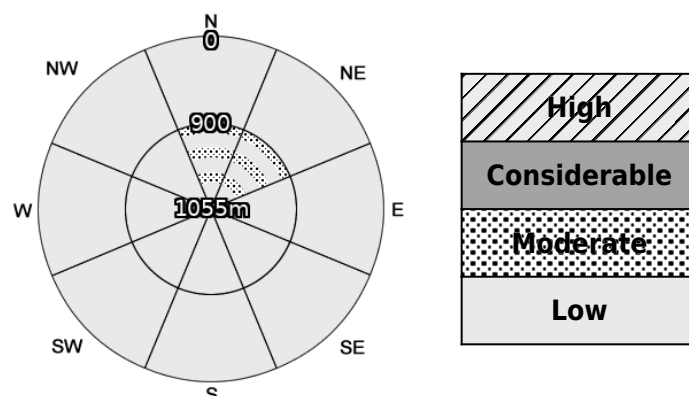
Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Later in the day new snow accumulations will begin to build mainly above 900 metres on Northerly to North-Easterly aspects. Where this achieves any depth it will be moderate well bonded with corrie rims, ridge flanks and gully exits most affected. Until mid afternoon most terrain will be bare of snow. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Freezing levels remaining around 800 metres overnight falling to around 500 metres during the day. Dry overnight and for most of the day, snowfall arriving from mid afternoon lying above 400 metres. Moderate Strength South-South-Easterly winds overnight and during the day veering strong South-Westerly from mid afternoon.

Comments

Colder later with snow arriving late in the day and through Thursday night.
