### Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Friday 01/01/2016


#### Avalanche Problems

#### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old snowpack will remain firm and stable. New accumulations of windslab will develop on North-West through North to East aspects above 900 metres. Coire rims gully tops and crag aprons will be mostly affected. Pockets of windslab will also develop in other lee areas due to cross loading. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



#### Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers are expected above 200 metres during the night on strong West-South-West winds. Dry through the day with strong winds backing to the South-South-East. The freezing level fluctuate at around 500 metres.

#### Comments

Remaining cold for the next few days, old snowpack is very firm, yesterdays rain has now frozen leaving sheets of ice in many places.
