

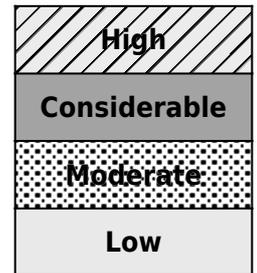


Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Fresh unstable windslab will build in higher locations with greatest accumulations in gullies and round corrie rims on West to North aspects above 900 metres. There will also be redistribution of the existing windslab to these aspects. The older snowpack will start to soften at lower levels but will remain stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Strong mainly South-East winds easing slowly through the period. Showers falling as snow to 500 metres initially gradually turning to rain on all but the highest summits. Freezing level 900 metres slowly rising to 1400 metres.

Comments

Hard and icy in some areas with drifting and windslab in others.
