

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Drifting snow with poor to weakly bonded windslab becoming more widespread on West to Northerly aspects above 950 metres. Areas most affected will be on steep terrain where significant depth overlies the old firm snowpack. More localised windslab will develop in other lee areas due to cross loading. Cornices will develop on these aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Snowfall continuing above 900 metres overnight; cooler through the day with snowfall above 700 metres. Strong to gale force South-East winds will back East-South-Easterly. The freezing level will lower to 800 metres.

Comments

Cooler tomorrow, snowfall continuing at higher levels.
