
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Generally the existing snowpack will become more stable as the temperature falls through the period. Some fresh localised deposits of unstable windslab will form on South-West through West to North facing slopes mainly above 800 metres. The areas most affected will be gully exits and corrie rims. The amounts are not expected to be great. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

The wind will be strong becoming gale force from an East-South-Easterly direction throughout. Light rain overnight will turn to light snow mainly above 800 metres during the day. The freezing level will fall from above the level of the summits to around 800 metres.

Comments

Prospect of colder weather into next week but remaining windy.
