
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised areas of fresh unstable windslab will form on South-West through West to North facing slopes mainly above 800 metres. Areas most affected will be gully exits (including those with a deeply recessed North-East aspect) and other sheltered areas. The amounts of fresh windslab are not expected to be great. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

The wind will be strong to gale force from an Easterly direction. Light snow will fall mainly above 850 metres overnight then down to 700 metres through the day. The freezing level will remain around 1000 metres overnight and then gradually fall during the day.

Comments

Strong Easterly winds forecast into next week. Generally drier in the Western Highlands.
