

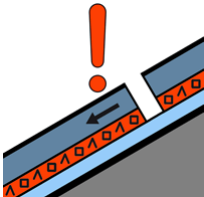

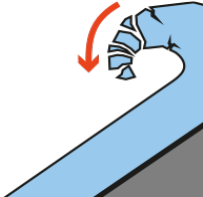

Wind Slab



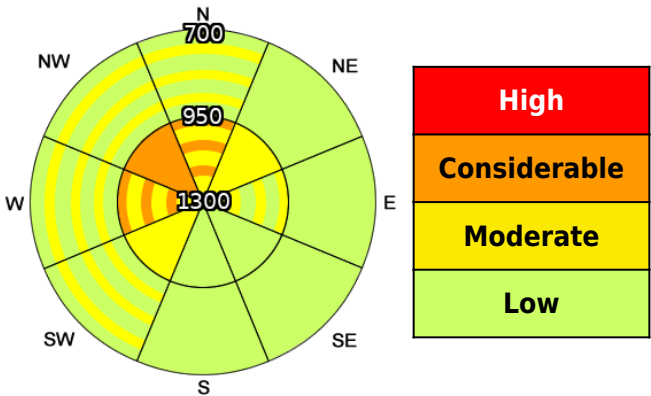

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Instabilities will remain in the windslab on Westerly to Northerly aspects above 950 metres with steep and convex shaped terrain high on corrie back walls most affected. In other places, although deep the snowpack is moderately well bonded. Below this level, deep accumulations of moderately well bonded snow are present in steep wind sheltered pockets, and gully walls. Many areas are wind scoured and bare with firm stable snow ice. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds remain strong East-South-Easterly overnight veering South-Easterly and strengthening during the day. Freezing levels will be around 6-700 metres throughout the forecast period. Light snowfall will persist with drifting.

Comments

Continuing wintry conditions. New unstable cornices developing on W to N aspects.
