

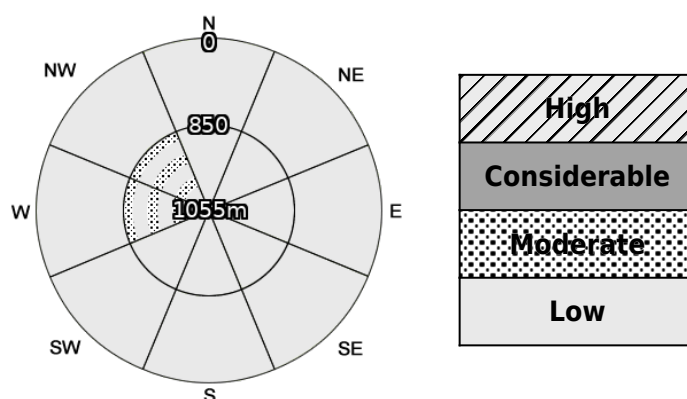

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 06/01/2016

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Minor instabilities will persist in the very localised accumulations of windslab, mainly on the inland mountains. Most affected will be steep lee slopes on West to North-West aspects above 850 metres. Elsewhere, there will be little to no accumulations of fresh snow. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Light snow, down to 600 metres will continue in the mountains inland from then coast . Strong Easterly winds will ease for a time overnight, veering East-South East and strengthening to gales by dusk. The freezing level will hover around 650 metres throughout the period.

Comments

Firm old snow, icy in places. Much riming in the cloud above 650 metres. Marked difference between coastal and inland mountains with minimal fresh snow and bright intervals on coastal mountains.
