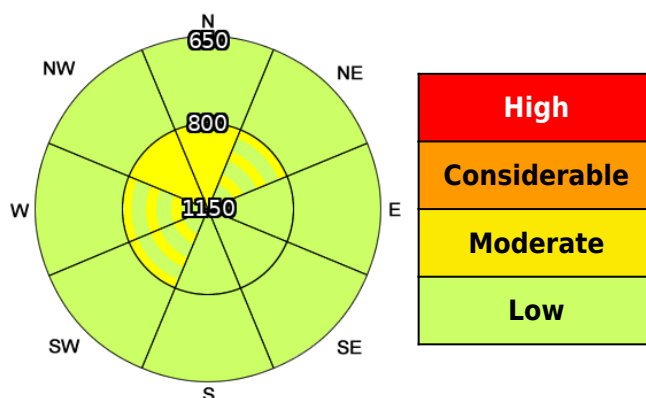


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 07/01/2016****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Generally the older, refrozen snowpack will be stable. Further fresh accumulations of unstable windslab will form on West through North to North-East aspects mainly above 800 metres. The areas most affected will be gully exits and other steep, sheltered areas. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

The wind will be from a generally South-Easterly direction before veering Westerly around mid-day. Winds will be gale force overnight before easing down through the day, becoming fresh. Mainly dry overnight then light snow through the day mainly above 750 metres. The freezing level will be around 800 metres overnight then falling to 500 metres through the day.
