

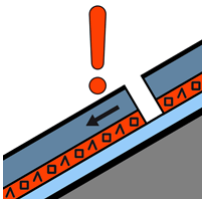

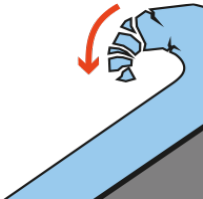

Wind Slab



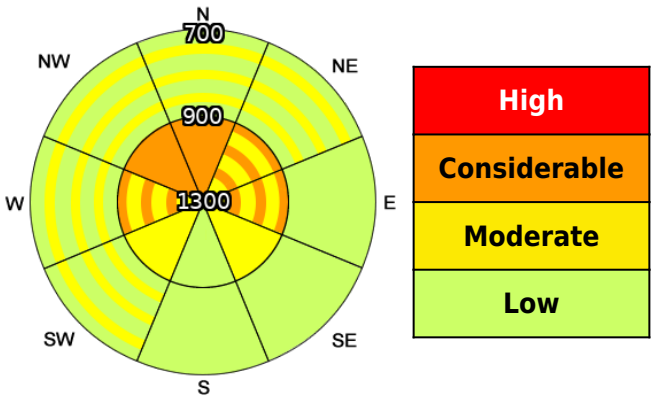

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will be present on West to Northerly aspects above 900 metres with steep convex terrain, gullies, and corrie back walls most affected, additionally, new poorly bonded windslab will build in isolated wind sheltered locations on North-East to Easterly aspects above 900 metres. Elsewhere the snowpack will generally stabilise and in wind exposed locations will be firm snow-ice. Large unstable cornices overhang West to North aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Freezing level will remain at 500 metres throughout the forecast period. Overnight, winds will be moderate strength Westerly backing light Southerly in the day. Some overnight snow above 400 metres, a dry morning with snow showers above 300 metres in the afternoon.
