

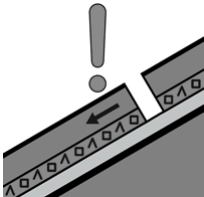

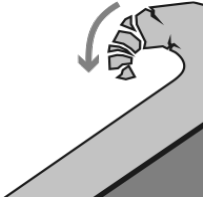

Wind Slab



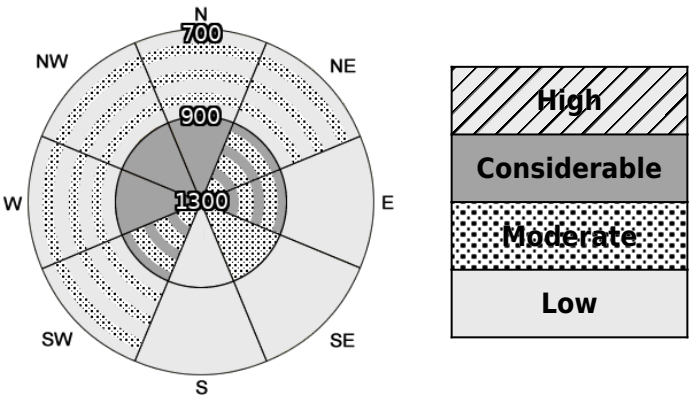

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will remain at first on Northerly to Easterly aspects above 900 metres. Through the day some redistributions of existing snow with new weakly bonded windslab developing on South-West to North-West aspects above 900 metres. Corrie back walls, gullies and steep convex terrain will be most affected. Elsewhere wind exposed areas will be wind scoured and stable. Large cornices will over hang West to North aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Light Southerly winds overnight will back to the East during the day and increase moderate to strong. Some light snow showers are expected during the afternoon. The freezing level will be around 500 metres.
