

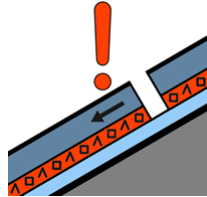

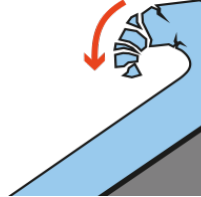

Wind Slab



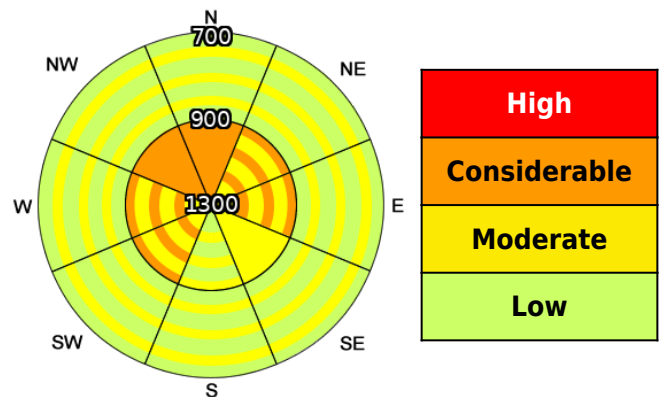

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Existing instabilities will persist on South-West through North to North-Easterly aspects above 900 metres especially in areas of steep and convex terrain. New weakly bonded windslab will develop on many other aspects in the variable winds. Gully tops, scarp slopes, and corrie rims will be especially affected. Unstable cornices will continue to develop. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Snowfall is expected through out the forecast period. Overnight the winds will be moderate to strong East to North-Easterly. Through the day North-West to South-West. The freezing level will be around 600 metres.

Comments

Widespread distribution of unstable windslab expected due to variable winds. Forecast is uncertain for snow amounts and timings
