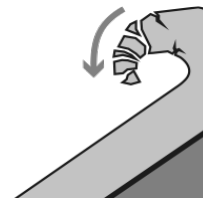

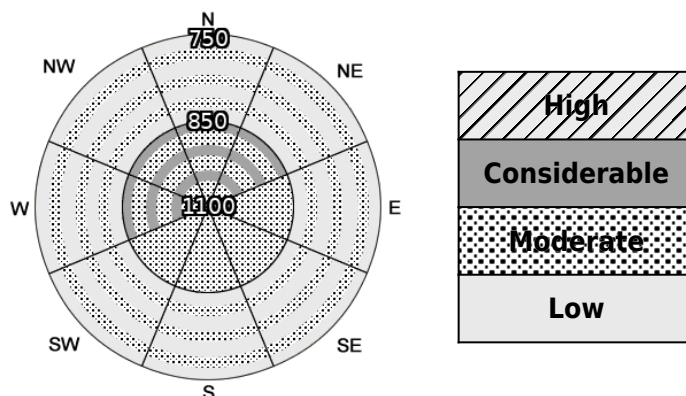

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Soft and marginally stabilised new windslab will form on steep and very sheltered lee slopes of all aspects above 850m. Most affected locations will be very steep West through North to North-East facing gully tops and steeper coire backwalls above 900m. Good stability on all exposed ridges. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Remaining cold with snow showers throughout the period. Winds will be moderate, easing to light Easterly overnight, then backing Northerly through to Southerly by late afternoon.

Comments

Low confidence in forecasted snow amounts. Check up to date sources in the morning and adjust mountain travel plans accordingly.
