

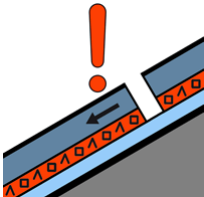

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 11/01/2016

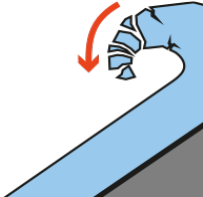
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab



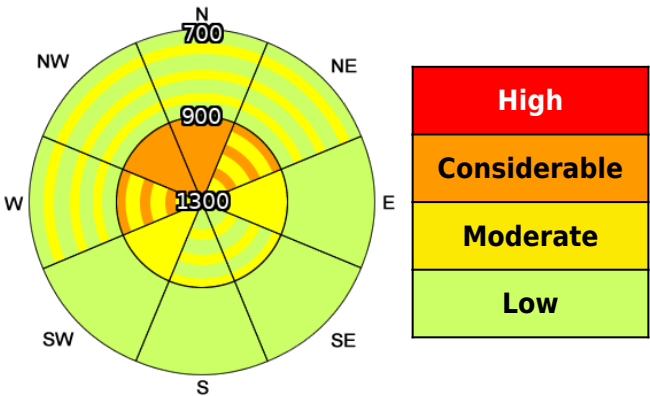
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New windslab will develop and overlie existing snowpack instabilities mostly on West through North to North-Easterly aspects above 900 metres. Areas of steep terrain convexities and corrie rims will be especially affected. More localised instabilities will persist on steep terrain in other areas. Cornices will be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Some light snow overnight on moderate to strong South-South-Westerly winds. During the day mostly dry, winds will ease to light and back South to South-Easterly. Freezing level lowering to 400 metres.

Comments

Cold temperatures continuing for the next few days.
