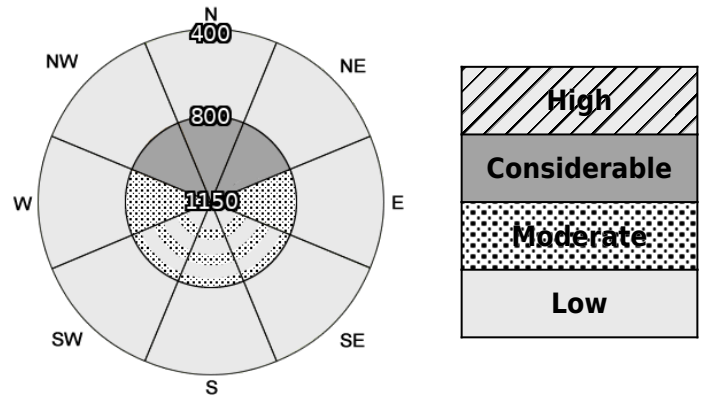

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Further accumulations of poorly bonded windslab will form on sheltered lee slopes mainly above 850 metres. Most affected locations will be on North-West to North-East aspects with sheltered gullies, corrie headwalls and scarp slopes being particularly affected. Localised instabilities will also exist on some other aspects but these are not expected to be significant. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, snow showers mainly above 500 metres with strong Southerly winds. During the morning the snow showers will ease for a period and the Southerly winds will moderate, light snow showers will return later in the morning, the freezing level will be around 500 metres for the duration.

Comments

Overnight, snow showers are expected to be quite persistent, drier through the day.
