

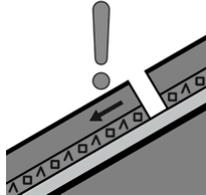

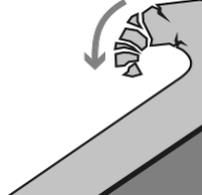

Wind Slab





Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised, weakly bonded windslab will be present on many sheltered aspects. The greatest accumulations will be on North through East to South East aspects above 850 metres. However, snow redistribution will form windslab on other sheltered aspects during the day, these deposits will also be localised. Locations particularly affected will be sheltered gullies, corrie headwalls and scarp slopes above 950 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, light snow showers accompanied by strong West-North-Westerly winds. During the day the winds will back to the West and eventually to East-South-East and it should be dry. The freezing level will slowly fall to 200 metres.

Comments

Unstable cornices will continue to develop.
