





**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Further accumulations of localised windslab will be deposited throughout the period. Weaknesses will persist in the windslab. Areas most affected will be steep corrie rims, gully tops and ridge flanks on East to South aspects above 800 metres. Other aspects will be affected due to cross loading. Cornices will continue to develop. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



**Forecast Weather Influences**

Snow showers will continue overnight and through the day, easing later. The wind will generally be fresh to strong throughout, West-North-West at first, veering Northerly during the day. Becoming a bit milder with the freezing level gradually rising to 500 metres by the end of the period.

**Comments**

Winds strengthened pre and during snow showers with plenty spindrift higher up. Snow blowing into deeper drifts. Exposed ridges and summits are more clear of snow. Some slivers of water ice forming on the crags.
