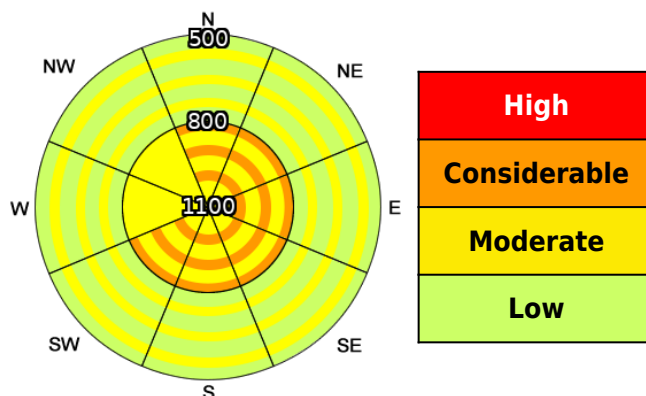

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Redistribution of snow will form fresh unstable windslab on South-East to South-West aspects above 800 metres. Unstable windslab will also be present on North through East to South-East above 800 metres. Existing weaknesses in the older snowpack will persist. Cornices will be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Initially moderate to strong North-North-Easterly, the wind is expected to back and ease overnight; light to moderate Southerly backing South-Easterly during the day. It will be mainly dry, with some snow during the afternoon. Freezing at all levels.

Comments

Cold conditions are maintaining weaknesses within the snowpack.
