

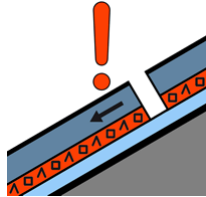

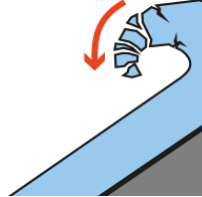

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Moderate to weakly bonded windslab will remain on steep North-West to North-Easterly aspects mostly above 900 metres with more localised unstable accumulations affecting these aspects below this altitude. Localised instabilities will also be present on many other aspects mainly in steep sheltered terrain. Unstable cornices will overhang North-West and Northerly aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.

Forecast Weather Influences

Dry at first with light snow flurries expected from early morning onwards. Light to moderate South-South-West winds will back through to the East-North-East by the afternoon. The freezing level will rise to 500 metres before falling to 300 metres towards the end of the day.
