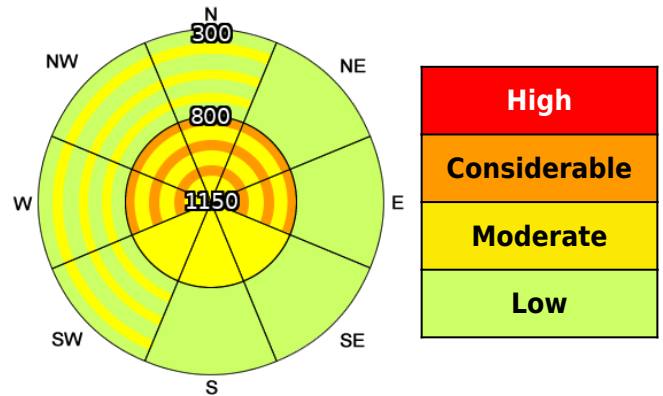

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised areas of unstable windslab will remain on West through North to East aspects, mainly above 800 metres. Some further deposits of fresh unstable windslab will form on South-West to North-West aspects due to redistribution. Areas most affected will be steep sheltered gullies and summit slopes. Cornices will continue to build and be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

The wind will be fresh easing to moderate through the day from a generally Easterly direction. Light snow after midnight initially above 400 metres rising to 800 metres during the day. The freezing level will fluctuate around 600 metres overnight before rising to 900 metres at the end of the day

Comments

Rising temperatures may see snowpack start to consolidate.
