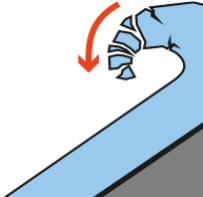

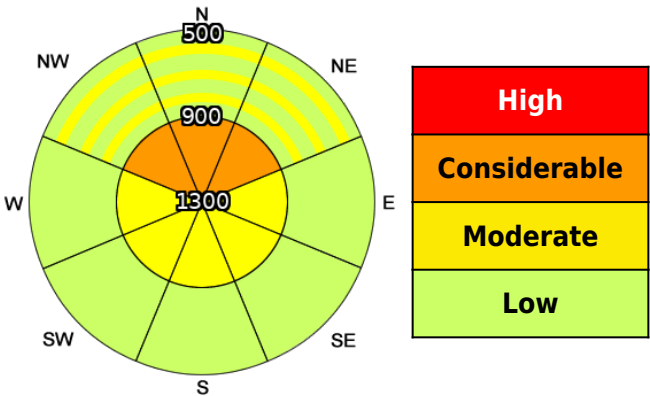

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will be moderate to weakly bonded on North-West to North-East aspects above 900 metres with corrie rims, gully tops, crag aprons and scarp slopes being most affected. New localised windslab will form around corrie rims on West to North aspects. More localised instabilities will remain on other aspects mostly in areas of steep and convex terrain. Large unstable cornices will overhang North-West to Northerly aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Dry conditions expected over the forecast period. Overnight moderate South-Easterly winds light through the day and veering South-Westerly. The freezing level will be around 500 metres.
