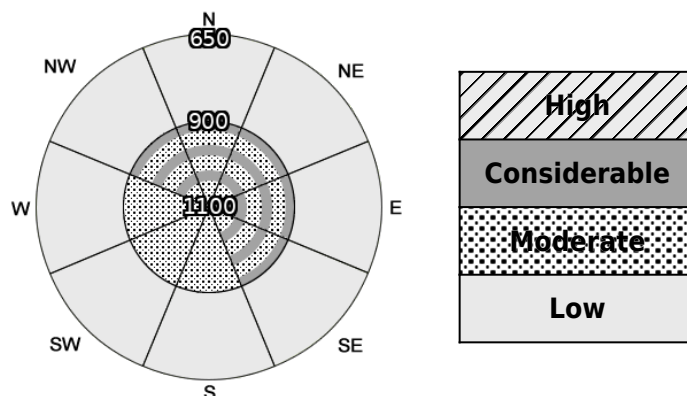
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

A little soft windslab is possible on most sheltered West aspects above 1000m. Lingering buried weaknesses will remain beneath both deep and shallow deposits of denser more supportive old snow. Most affected locations will be steepest North West through North to South East aspects above 900m where instability will be localised. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

No precipitation is forecast. Light Easterly winds becoming very light South Easterly during the day. Remaining cold and turning progressively colder.

Comments

Dense old snow now forming a supportive bridge over buried weak layers making triggering more uncertain but with increased potential for larger avalanches.

Misty from 400m to 900m today, with milky sunshine at higher altitudes.
