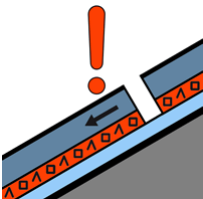


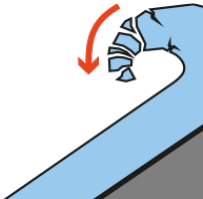

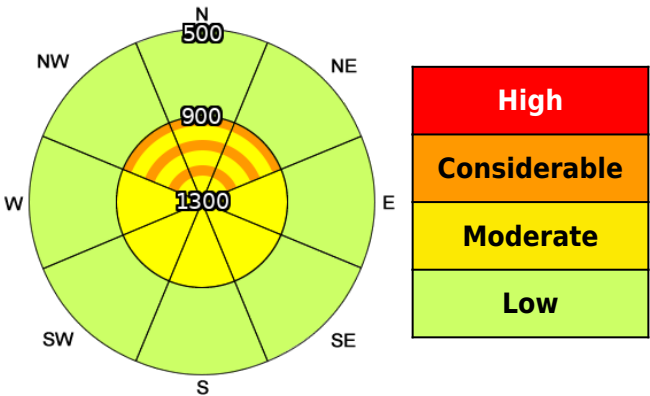
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable snow will be present on mainly North-West to North-Easterly aspects above 900 metres with steep and convex terrain in gully exits and corrie back walls most affected. On other aspects steep localised and convex terrain will be moderately stable due to persistent instabilities. Elsewhere and below this level the snowpack will be generally consolidated and stability will be good. Large unstable cornices overhang Northerly aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

No precipitation is expected. Winds will be light to moderate strength South to South-Westerly. Freezing level will be around 600 metres.
