
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised areas of fresh unstable windslab will build mainly on North to East aspects above 900 metres. This will become increasingly unstable as the temperature rises during the day. Sheltered gullies and corrie rims will be most affected. The older snowpack will consolidate in the colder overnight temperatures and will be mainly stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Strong South-West backing South-South-West winds. Showers overnight falling as snow above 900 metres followed by a drier day with occasional showers falling as snow only on the highest summits. Freezing level around 1000 metres overnight rising to just above the summits.

Comments

Very warm this morning. Slightly colder tomorrow before another warm period.
