

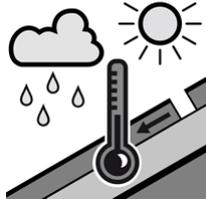



Wind Slab





Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will continue to thaw and become more saturated with the onset of rain. Instabilities will persist on many aspects above 900 metres mostly within areas of steep and convex terrain. Cornices will become more unstable and prone to collapse. Localised accumulations of windslab will develop at the end of the day mainly around corrie rims on North to East aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Freezing levels well above the summits up until the end of the day when it will become a little cooler. Strong to gale force South-South-Westerly winds continuing. Rain at all levels through the day, this will turn to snow at the end of the day.

Comments

Cornice collapse and rock and ice fall will continue to be a hazard.
