

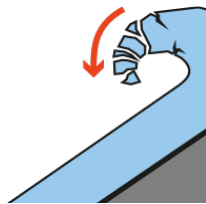

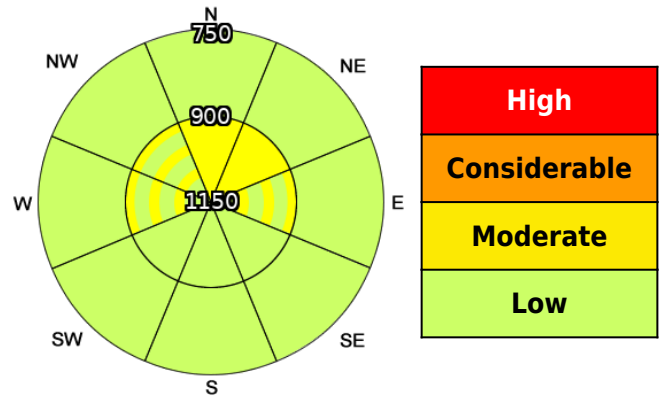
Wet Snow

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

At first, localised wet snow instabilities will exist on steepest North-West through North to East aspects mainly above 900 metres. Cornices will be suspect during thaw conditions. Later in the afternoon as the freezing level lowers the wet snowpack will start to consolidate. New accumulations of fresh snow are not expected to be significant. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

The mild conditions will continue to dominate most of Monday with some rain showers these will be accompanied by gale force Southerly winds. The freezing level will lower to around 800 metres during the latter part of Monday afternoon with light snow showers above 750 metres.

Comments

New snow accumulations are not expected to be significant and will be short lived, mild conditions are forecast to return during early Tuesday.
