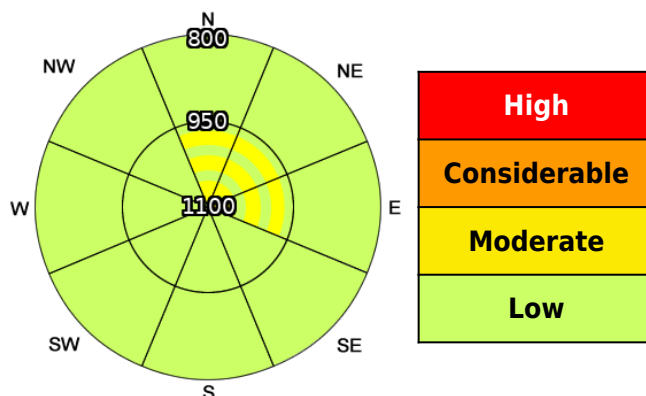
Avalanche Problems



Wet Snow

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Some localised, loose wet snow instabilities will persist on steepest North to East aspects above 950m. Stability will progressively improve in all locations as the Freezing level lowers again to below summits. Snow showers late in the day are unlikely to develop any significant depth within the forecast period. Any remaining cornices will be suspect during thaw conditions. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Mild conditions, becoming cooler around mid afternoon. Strong to gale force South-Westerly winds. Light rain at all levels turning to snow towards the end of the forecast period.

Comments

Dramatic snow loss with only major gully lines retaining snow , some patches above 750m. Rock and ice fall are an additional hazard during the thaw period!
