



##### Avalanche Problems




Wind Slab

##### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New weakly bonded windslab expected on steep, sheltered North-West through North to East aspects above 900m. Period of poorest stability will be when snow turns to rain at all elevations during the late morning. New weak cornices will be prone to sudden collapse with the onset of much milder temperatures and rain. The remainder of the old much reduced snowpack will remain moist but well stabilised. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



##### Forecast Weather Influences

Much colder overnight with a few snow showers. Heavier precipitation during the day, initially snow but turning to rain at all levels by late morning. Winds strong South- Westerly, later Southerly.

##### Comments

Sustained thaw. Snowpack now pinned back to patches above 750m, with largest on North to East aspects above 800m. Colder conditions for a time on Tuesday but a rapid thaw expected late morning.
