

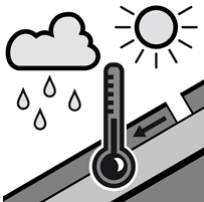

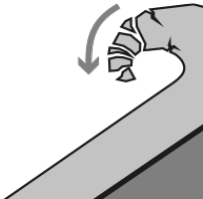

Wind Slab



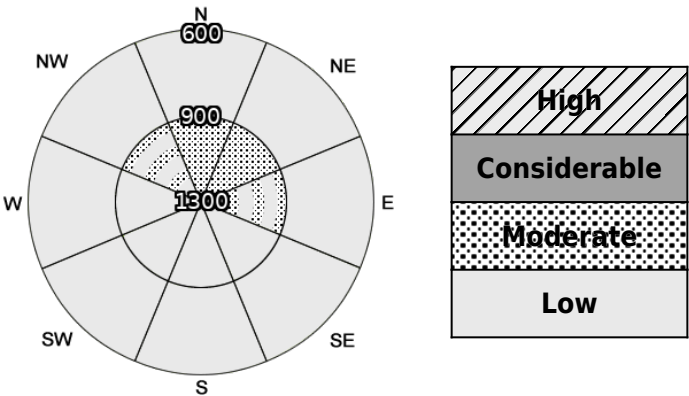

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will become firmer and more consolidated in the cooler temperatures. New windslab will develop on North-West through North to Easterly aspects above 900 metres. Corrie rims and gully tops will be especially affected. Localised pockets will form in other sheltered areas due to cross loading. New accumulations will become more unstable during the rise in temperature and onset of rain. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

A cool spell overnight with snowfall above 600 metres. This will turn to rain at all levels by midday as the freezing level rises to well above the summits. Winds will be strong to gale force South to South-Westerly.
