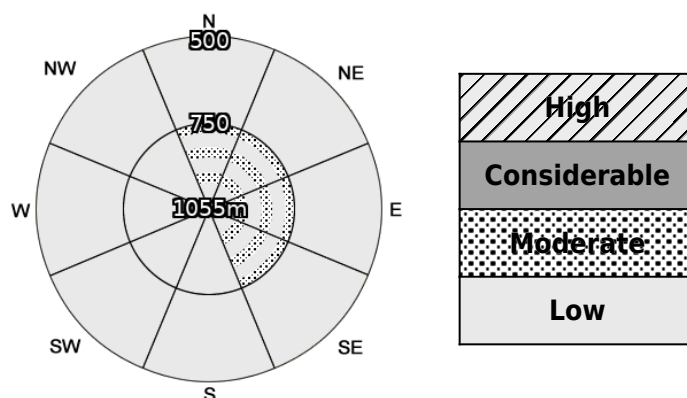
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised areas of unstable windslab will develop on North through East to South-East aspects on steep slopes above 750 metres. Most affected will be corrie rims and gully exits, notably where windslab lies on old snow. Existing areas of older snow will re-freeze and will be stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

There will be a quiet dry spell overnight with moderate South-West winds and the freezing level lowering to 600 metres. During the day however, there will be increasing amounts of snow above 500 metres, with strengthening Westerly winds. The freezing level will lower to around 500 metres.

Comments

Turning wintry again. Low confidence in the amount of snow predicted for tomorrow.
