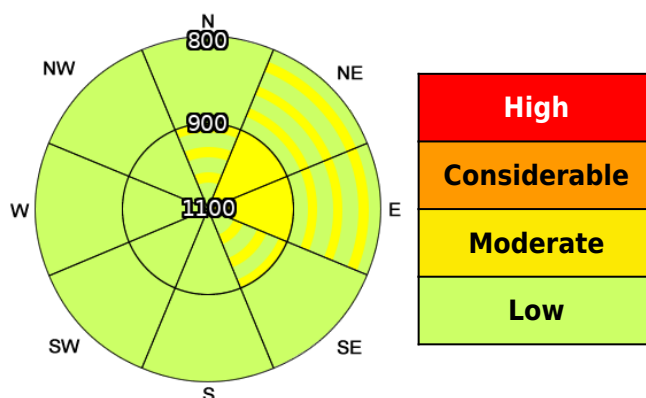

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Initial improvement in stability in all locations as the old snowpack refreezes. New multilayered, moderately bonded windslab development on steep and sheltered North through East to South-East above 900 metres. Good stability on all wind exposed aspects. Soft new cornice development expected over steepest lee slopes. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Becoming much colder. Some overnight snow showers, more persistent later in the day. Winds falling light, becoming moderate by midday. Winds initially South Westerly then becoming turbulent and Westerly later.

Comments

Minging day on Tuesday. Not as much snow as expected but quite a lot of rainfall! A few wet sluffs noted high on North and North-East aspects today. A little uncertainty over forecasted snow amounts, may be a little more during the morning.
