

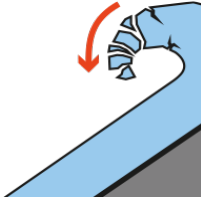

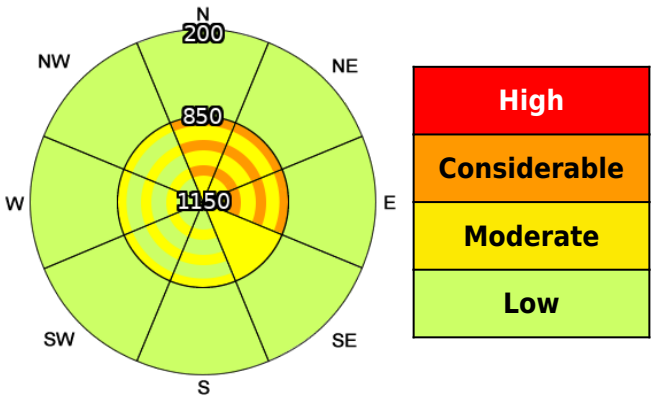
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Further deposits of fresh snow will fall above 200 metres with the greatest accumulations being above 850 metres, here, deposits of unstable windslab will develop in sheltered locations mainly on North through East to South-East aspects. Slopes exposed to the wind will become firm and stable. New fragile cornices will also form on similar aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, light snow showers above 100 metres with strong to gale force West-South-Westerly winds. During the day snow showers will become more persistent with strong to gale force South-Westerly winds. The freezing level will slowly rise through the forecast period the 1100 metres.

Comments

The freezing level will gradually rise during tomorrow leading to instabilities later in the day on lowers slopes.
