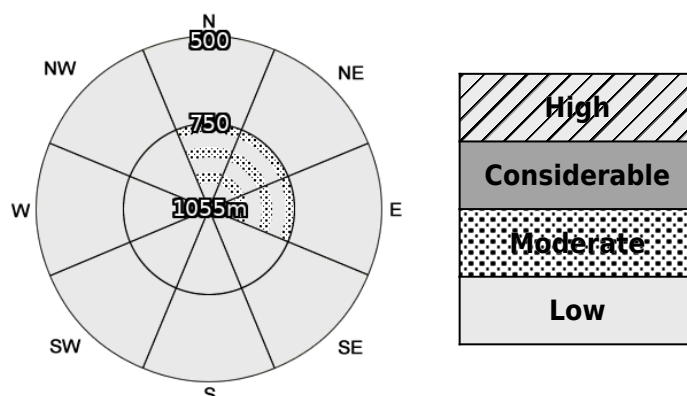
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The limited old snowpack will remain firm and stable. Fresh windslab will develop, mainly in the afternoon, on North to East aspects above 750 metres. Amounts are expected to be small and localised, mainly on steep slopes such as gully tops, corrie rims and ridge flanks. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Light snow showers overnight will intensify in the afternoon. A fresh to strong South-Westerly wind will be maintained through the day. There will be a gradual rise in temperature with the freezing level reaching the summits by the end of the period.

Comments

The forecasted snow eventually arrived mid afternoon, with moderate falls on the summits.
