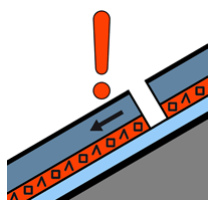

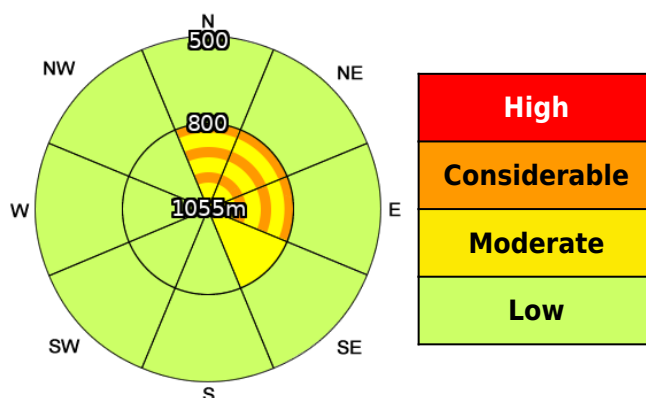

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

On North to East aspects above 800 metres where windslab accumulations are greatest avalanches are likely during the night. As the freezing level drops early in the day the snow pack will refreeze and become well bonded with localised windslab forming on North to East aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Extremely heavy rain at all levels during the night. Winds predominately South-Westerly with gusts in excess of 100 mph in the early hours. During the night the freezing level will rise to 1600 metres before rapidly dropping to around 500 metres at dawn. Mostly dry during the day with the occasional snow shower on very strong South-Westerly winds.
