

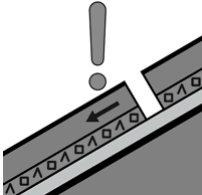

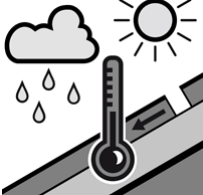

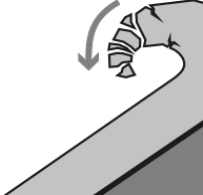
Wind Slab



Persistent Weak Layers



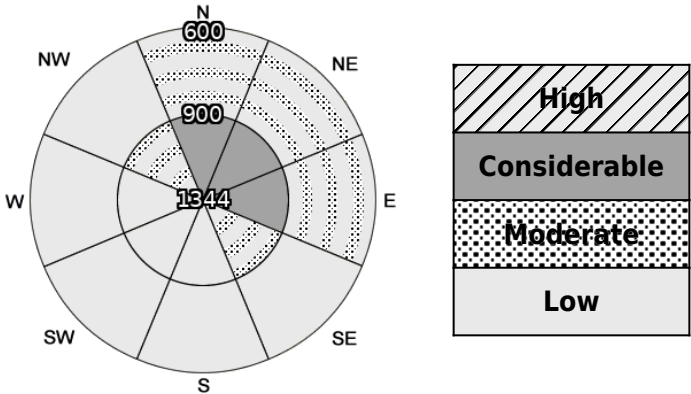

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

There will be a period of increased instability in the warm, wet conditions overnight when avalanches are likely mainly on steep North to East aspects above 900 metres. The snowpack will stabilise as the temperature drops during the day but fresh unstable windslab will build again with greatest accumulations on North to East aspects above 900 metres. Cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Very strong mainly South-Westerly winds. Heavy rain to summit level overnight then snow showers during the day. Freezing level above the summits overnight falling to 600 metres in the afternoon.
