

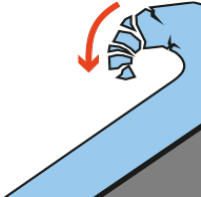

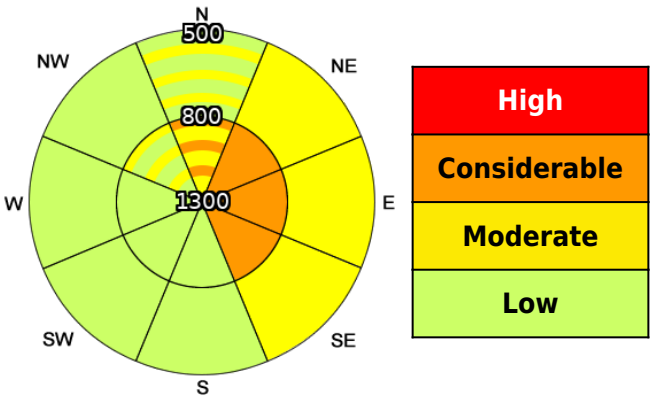

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Poorly bonded windslab will develop quickly and avalanches are likely on steep North through East to South-East aspects above 800 metres. Corrie rims gully exits, crag aprons and scarp slopes will be especially affected. Localised windslab will develop in other areas due to cross loading. Cornices will be unstable. Windslab will develop below this altitude and be moderately bonded where significant depth develops in steep terrain above 500 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

The freezing level will fall to 200 metres overnight and rise to 400 metres during the day. Continuous snowfall is expected at all levels throughout the forecast period on storm force West-South-Westerly winds.
