
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The little remaining old snow will refreeze. New accumulations of windslab will build in any sheltered locations, predominantly on North to South-East aspects above 700 metres with the tops of gullies and corrie rims most affected. Other aspects will be affected by cross loading. Windward slopes and ridges will be scoured. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Very strong West-South-Westerly winds overnight with gusts to 80 mph will veer Westerly during the afternoon. Snow showers overnight will become more prolonged during the day. The freezing level will be near sea level during the night rising to 400 metres later in the day.
