

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Overnight further accumulations of windslab will accumulate in locations sheltered from the strong Westerly winds, primarily in the tops of gullies and round corrie rims on North-East to South-East aspects above 700 metres. Later in the day as the winds become Southerly snow will begin to be redistributed onto North-West to North-East aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Frequent snow showers overnight on strong Westerly winds will become lighter during the day as the wind backs Southerly and decreases in strength. By the end of the forecast period the wind will be South-Easterly around 20 mph. The freezing level will be around 400 metres rising slightly towards the end of the day.
