





Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Areas of unstable snow will be present on many sheltered slopes. Greatest accumulations will be on steep North-East, East and South-East aspects. During the day, unstable snow will also form on North-West and North aspects. Avalanches are likely in these locations above 800 metres. Wind scoured slopes will remain frozen and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

The strong Westerly winds will slowly ease and back to the South-East by Sunday afternoon. Showers will continue during the day, initially as snow at lower levels but gradually turning to rain over the summits by late afternoon
