

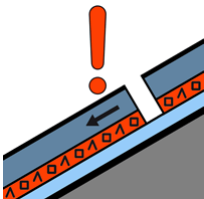

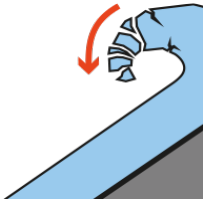

Wind Slab



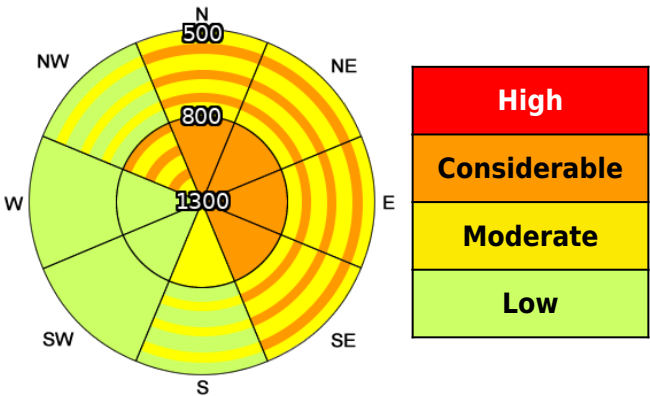

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Poorly bonded windslab will continue to develop with avalanches likely on steep Northerly through East to South-East aspects above 800 metres. More localised weakly bonded snow will be present on these aspects above 500 metres where deep accumulations persist on steep and convex terrain. Unstable windslab will also lie in other lee areas due to cross loading. Cornices will be fragile. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Very cold with snowfall continuing overnight on strong Westerly winds. Through the day West-South-Westerly winds will ease to moderate and snow showers will die out by the afternoon. The freezing level will rise to 700 metres by the end of the day.
