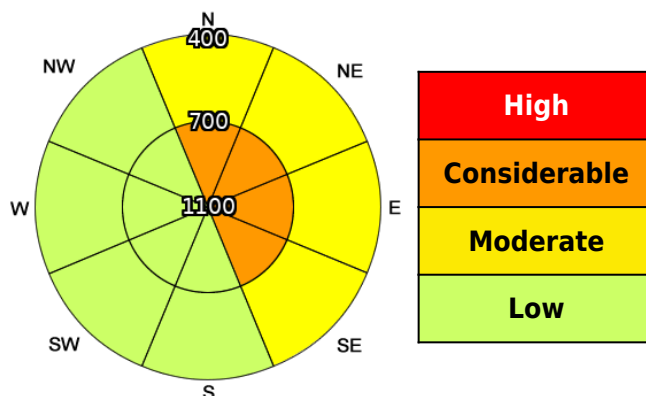

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

There will be a period of wet snow instability overnight as the existing snowpack becomes saturated. Avalanches are likely on North through East to South-East aspects above 700 metres. During the day the existing snowpack will consolidate in the colder conditions. Fresh unstable deposits of windslab are expected in sheltered locations above 700 metres, mainly on the aspects mentioned above. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight the freezing level will rise well above the summits, and heavy rain will fall at all levels. Through the day rain showers will increasingly turn to snow above 500 metres as the freezing level drops. Very strong West-South-Westerly winds are expected.
