

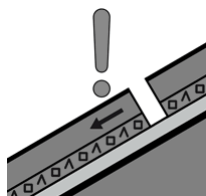

Avalanche Problems



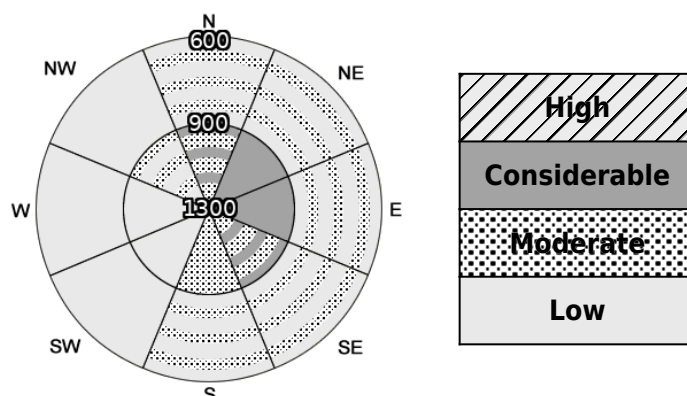
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised unstable windslab deposits will be present on mainly North-East to Easterly aspects above 900 metres with some localised deep deposits in wind sheltered places on North and South-East facing slopes due to cross loading. Scarp slopes, gully exits and corrie rims most affected. Below this level, localised moderately well bonded deposits are confined to steep wind sheltered places. Elsewhere, many wind exposed areas are bare or firm snow-ice. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds will lessen in strength overnight, strong Westerly at first veering North-North-Westerly then Westerly and of moderate strength. Light snow showers overnight will die out by day break. Freezing level around 500 metres throughout the period.

Winds lessening and a good winters day in prospect.
