

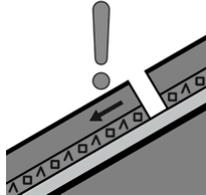

Avalanche Problems




Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will remain present in isolated places on North through East to South-Easterly aspects above 900 metres, summit gullies and exits and corrie rims will be most affected. Elsewhere, wind exposed slopes will be either bare or with firm snow ice. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Light snow overnight will die out and it will be a largely dry day. The strong Westerly winds will decrease in strength becoming light North-Westerly backing South-westerly during the day. Freezing level will remain at around 500 metres.
