

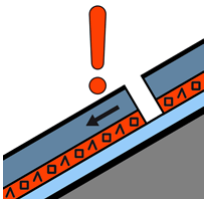

Wind Slab



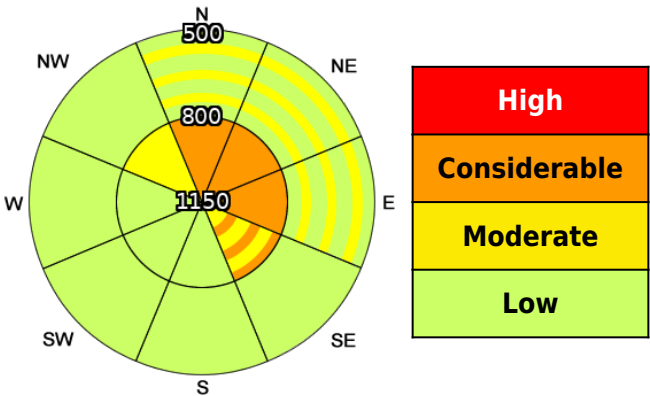
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Overnight wind slab will continue to build before the onset of rain and temperatures rise through the day. The snowpack will be poorly bonded on North through East to South-Easterly aspects above 800 metres. North to East aspects will be particularly affected especially sheltered convex rolls and corrie rims, cornices will become unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds will be strong, mainly South-Westerly. There will be moderate snow showers overnight. These showers will turn to rain as the freezing level rises from 450 metres overnight to 1600 meters by tomorrow afternoon.
