



Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Overnight further deposits of windslab are expected. Through the day both the fresh and older deposits of windslab will begin to thaw. Wet snow instabilities will exist, and avalanches are likely, on mainly North-East to South-East aspects above 700 metres. Cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

A band of light snow will cross the area overnight. Through the day further light snow will turn to drizzly rain at all levels as the freezing level rises above the tops. Moderate winds will be from the West or South-West.

A mild, damp and cloudy day expected on Thursday.
