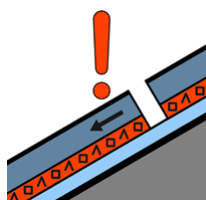
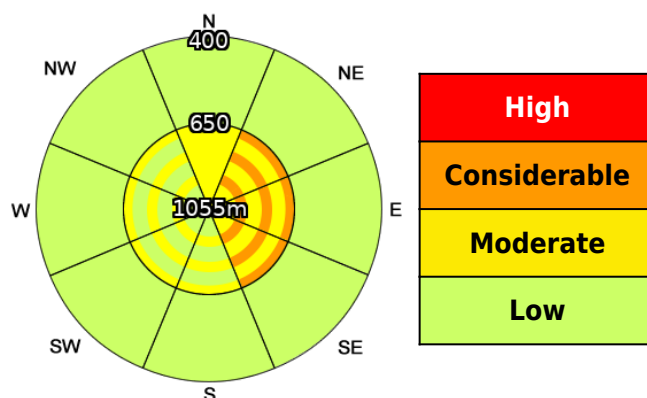


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE CONSIDERABLE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Saturday 06/02/2016****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Persistent Weak Layers****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Due to the cooling temperature the old snow pack will re-freeze and stabilise. However freshly deposited windslab will build on mainly North through East to South- East aspects above 650 metres. Later, redistributed snow will build localised unstable windslab on sheltered South-West to North-Westerly slopes, especially gully tops and corrie rims. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Strong South- West winds will back South through to East - South-East by the afternoon. Moderate snow showers are forecast for this evening and throughout the night. The freezing level will be 500 metres rising to 800 meter by the end of the period.
