




Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old snow pack will stabilise with the lower temperatures. New windslab instabilities will build on West through North to East aspects above 650 metres, especially on corrie rims, gully tops and scarp slopes. Due to cross loading localised windslab instabilities will affect all other aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

There will be a colder South-West airflow tonight, gale force at times, veering Westerly and easing during the morning. The wind then becomes variable, backing Easterly before returning South-South-East. Prolonged showers are expected throughout the day falling as snow on higher ground. At first the freezing level will rise, then lower to hover around 650 metres.
