
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Overnight, there will be fresh accumulations of moderately well bonded windslab deposited in localised sheltered locations above 650 metres mainly on North to North-East aspects. Most affected will be coire rims, steep summit slopes and gully exits. Additionally, weaknesses will persist in the existing windslab on similar slopes and aspects, including North-West aspects. The exposed older snowpack will be firm and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

A strong Southerly wind will ease and back to a light North-West then West during the day. Overnight snowfall will peter out into an occasional snow shower during the day, with rain below 650 metres. The freezing level will gradually rise to around 700 metres by the end of the period.

Comments

Mild and wet day as the freezing level rose to summits. Overnight snowfall not forecast to be in significant amounts.
