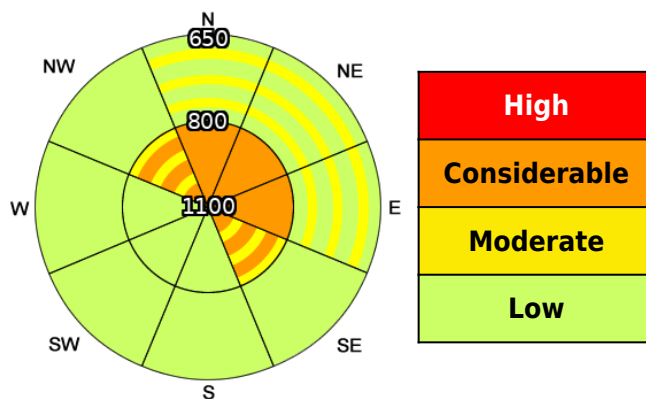

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Areas of weakly bonded windslab will continue to develop on very sheltered North to East aspects above 800m where avalanches are likely. Cross-loading on steep gully flanks and exits is also expected on other aspects and on sheltered scarp slopes. New weak cornice development on recent lee slopes. All recently wind scoured locations will be hard or crusty and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Further overnight snow showers above 600m will become scattered as the strong South-Westerly winds ease and become more Westerly during the day. Freezing levels will remain below summits throughout.

The full Scottish; very wintry on tops with heavy sleet / rain ensuring a good soaking at lower elevations!
