



Avalanche Problems




Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

During the day, accumulations of fresh unstable windslab will develop on steep sheltered locations, mainly on South-East to South aspects above 650 metres and localised instabilities will exist, particularly where it overlies the older refrozen snowpack. Existing instabilities on North to East aspects will diminish and the snowpack will stabilise. Elsewhere the old snowpack will remain firm and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Slow moving light snow showers will continue overnight, and intensify during the day with longer periods of snow. Light, generally Westerly winds initially will strengthen to a strong and gusty North-North-Westerly by the end of the period. The freezing level will gradually lower from 800 metres to 400 metres later.

Comments

Small amount of snowfall last night together with a slight thaw to mid levels and refreeze as it cleared. Becoming colder.
